ASH FLOWER GALL

Description: Tiny mites will feed on the male flower clusters, turning them into irregular, fringed masses that will start out green in color and turn black as they dry.

Host Plants: Ash

Damage: The galls are unsightly and can kill twig growth. Typically lasting up to 2 years.

Control: Insecticides can be used to help control the mites. Treatments need to be applied at bud break.
