OAK WILT

Description: Symptoms usually start in mid-May to early June and continue throughout the summer. Affected trees initially show a bronzing or wilting of leaves on an individual branch or in a portion of the tree crown. Within a few weeks, the wilted leaves will begin to drop. This will spread throughout the tree canopy during the summer.

Host Plants: Oaks, most common in Red Oaks

Damage/Control: Trees that are over 5% infested must be removed. A macro injection of Alamo fungicide can be injected into the trees as a preventative. Alamo injections will provide two years of protection.
