PLANT HEALTH CARE FACTS

ZIMMERMAN PINE MOTH

Description: Larvae tunnel beneath the bark of the trunk and branches, usually where the branch is attached to the trunk. Pale yellow, popcorn-like masses of sap occur at the wounds.

Host Plants: Austrian, Scotch, Jack, Ponderosa, and White Pine trees, occasionally Spruce.

Damage: Tunneling damage can girdle the trunk and branches, physically weakening the tree. Infested trees show branch dieback, deformed growth, and may die.

Control: Insecticide sprayed once in April and once in August.
